INTERCULTURAL DEVELOPMENT INVENTORY

Paul writes a prayer to the church at Philippi. "And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ to the glory and praise of God." Part of that knowledge and depth of insight comes from increased awareness of ourselves, our culture, and those outside the dominant culture.

Atlantic Coast Conference's Anti Racism Task Group has compiled resources for the conference and congregations in hopes to foster desire for change in individuals and congregations. The Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI) is one of the tools the Anti Racism Task Group suggests for congregations.

Ministry Team has approved members of the Administration Commission, Ministry Team and TCRC to take the (IDI) to create a pathway to guide us in the work of building awareness of experiences of people outside of dominant culture. We do this to keep integrity as a church and be committed to reflecting the way of Jesus. We wish to understand the reality and impact of white dominant culture and unhook from what that means.

The IDI is an assessment tool that measures intercultural competence, the ability to engage effectively and appropriately with people who are different from ourselves. It is designed for use by leaders in planning for organizations/groups work toward intercultural competence.

Ridgeview plans to use the IDI to develop benchmarks and create plans to foster deeper awareness about power and privilege in any cultural context. Members of the Administration Commission, Ministry Team and TCRC will take the 50 item online questionnaire. The results will be reviewed by one of MCUSA's Qualified Administrator. The QA will schedule a group debrief with the Administration Commission, Ministry Team and TCRC. The group debrief will include basic information about the intercultural development continuum and explain the group's placement on the continuum as represented by the composite scores. The QA will provide suggestions for next steps based on the current information. The IDI approach is developmental, not judgmental, and meets each individual where they are now, assuming an intention to move forward with support. Jill Heine

It is likely we will want to continue to live-stream our church service which will enable persons who are sick, as well as Ridgeview participants who are traveling, or those who cannot be present on Sunday morning for work or other reasons, to more fully participate in the life and witness of our congregation.

As we enter 2021, we wish each of you all the best. We ask that you continue to be involved and use your gifts to witness to the love of God both in our church community, our local community and around the world. Please pray for the witness of our congregation that we may follow Jesus Christ and by the power of the Holy Spirit grow as a community of love, grace, joy and peace, so that God's healing and hope flow through us to a hurting world.

The \$1,094 given beyond the goal will be used for foyer renovations. The December meal provided \$3,325 for foyer renovations, making a total of \$4,419 for the foyer project.

Marsha Horst, our treasurer, said that "Ridgeview is a giving congregation" and that she is "inspired by the commitment to steward resources for the sake of the kingdom of God."
