**The Pastoral Search Committee** met for the first meeting on Tuesday evening, May 30.

Joanne Dietzel, ACC Conference Minister, described the process that will set a path for this work.

It was a time to notice that as a congregation, we have had a series of changes in a short time.

The Latin word *limen* means "threshold." Liminal space is a place betwixt and between, having left one stage but not yet entered the next. It is a graced time but in such a time we are not certain or always in control.

Sometimes thresholds come fast and furious! We at Ridgeview have come to terms with a pandemic which included a lot of loss. We crossed another threshold by moving from one room to another. We crossed a threshold by sharing space in our building, even on the same day, even at the same time!

Now we are on another threshold, another new beginning. The mystery of transformation (stepping over the threshold) more often happens *not when something new happens, but when something falls apart.* We need patience and guidance and the freedom to let go of tightening our control and letting go of certitudes. Holding on to nostalgia or certitude is not life. Maybe that's what Jesus is describing when he says, "It is a narrow gate and a hard road that leads to life, and only a few find it."

Living in a liminal space means living in a transitional space for awhile. We need each other as we spend time at this threshold to help each other create and hold the tension between one space and the next. To encourage each other through the process we begin tonight.

Loving, patient, faithful, wisdom God,

We enter this liminal space knowing that you are generous in these attributes. We have experienced them as a community of faith. May we also be loving, patient, faithful and wise as we open ourselves to a time of learning in this work of calling a pastor.
