## TUESDAY ALIVE June 13

Lois Miklas from 1719 Museum in Willow Street (formerly Hans Herr House) shared information on Native American life here in the Susquehanna Valley before Europeans came and the life changes they brought.



First Peoples, Indigenous, Native American, American Indian are descriptors given by others. Most prefer to be called by their nation or tribe. Susquehannocks, Conestoga, Shawnee, Lenni Lanape (this nation still active in the Philadelphia area).

Susquehannocks lived in long houses along the Susquehanna River. These houses sheltered multiple families grouped by women's lineages. At their prime, Washington Boro had a group of 90 long houses with a population of about 2900 people.

Europeans brought cloth traded for hides, glass which was used in beading décor, metal to sharpen arrow points. Trading also included danger like guns and disease. About 90% of the tribe was wiped out by disease. Eventually, the remnant moved along the Pequea in Manor Township. They became known as the Conestoga and the area as Indian-town.



The 1763 Massacre, as it was known, attributed to the Paxton Boys from Harrisburg brought an end to this group.

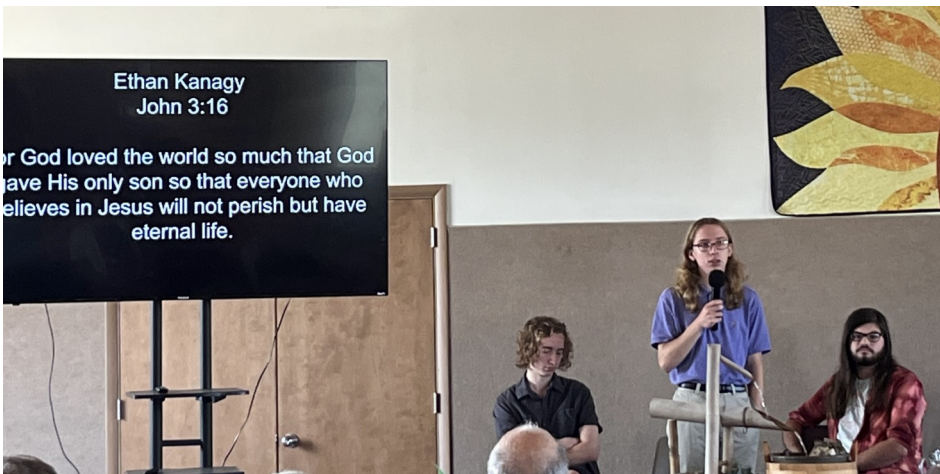
